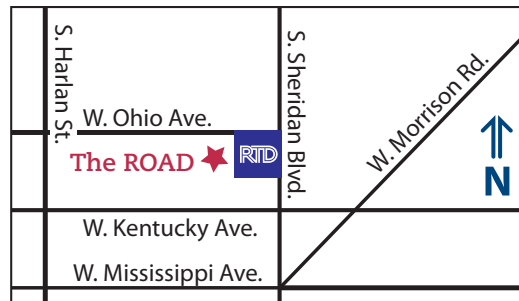

The ROAD provides transitional services to develop the skills necessary to positively transition to adulthood, avoid risky behavior and achieve greater self-sufficiency.

The ROAD is an award-winning drop-in resource center for youth, ages 15 to 22, who live in the Jefferson, Gilpin or Clear Creek County areas. All of the activities offered at The ROAD help you develop as a person and learn the skills to make it on your own. As a program of Jefferson Center for Mental Health, The ROAD is staffed by mental health professionals, interns and volunteers, all of whom are invested in making your time at The ROAD beneficial, fun and safe.

Services at The ROAD are designed to engage you in setting your own goals, designing your own future.

Enhance your leadership potential and skills. Increase your confidence and comfort to lead others.

Transition Services

- **BrainWise** – Join this group to build your critical thinking and decision making skills. Learn to control impulsive behavior, identify choices and assess the consequences of your actions.
- **Independent Living Skills** – Learn how to budget, shop and cook, fix your car, find an apartment and a job. Your weekly participation earns you incentives needed to help you achieve greater independence.
- **Healthy Relationships** – Discuss the key relationships in your life – friends, family, girlfriends, boyfriends, etc. What is healthy and productive? What should you expect from other people in your life?

Counseling and other mental health services are available through The ROAD and **CrossRoads** programs.

- **Jobs** – Receive help with job readiness and job search, resume writing, mock interviews, job application assistance and more. The program is available to youth ages 15-22.
- **HSE (High School Equivalency)** – If you're between the ages of 17 and 25, we can help you study for your GED, TASC or HiSET with FREE tutoring by an education specialist.
